## "The Skating Party" Comprehension and analysis

## Instructions:

- 1. These are short answer type questions which require FULL sentences.
- 2. Include direct examples from the story as support.
- 3. Use loose leaf to write your answers.

## **Questions:**

- A. This story involves several instances of foreshadowing (providing hints in the story as to future actions through other events or the weather or dialogue). <u>Identify AND EXPLAIN</u> at least 3 examples of foreshadowing.
- B. The story begins with a discussion of the Stone Man. Why did the author choose to include this story, considering that it seems unrelated to the actual events of the skating party? Consider who or what it could represent.
- C. Irony is the unexpected twist in a story. Explain the irony at the end of the story **being sure to use the word BUT** in your explanation.
- D. Theme is a statement of belief suggested by the author<u>; it cannot be a</u> <u>word or phrase.</u> What is the theme of this story? Provide at least 2 examples to support your idea.
- E. Why was this story selected in the Teens section of the course when it involves the life of Uncle Nathan who is older? Consider the narrator in your answer.
- F. Through dialogue and storytelling of Uncle Nathan, his character is developed. <u>Choose 5 specific quotes</u> and <u>the trait</u> each quote suggests. Use the list of traits provided to select specific words rather than general ones.
- G. The story provides the reader with description both direct and indirect of Eunice and Delia. Using the Venn Diagram provided, <u>compare and contrast</u> the sisters <u>including quotations</u> as support.
